Introducing new strategic initiatives

More educational programs, more grant making, and more connections.

Three New Partner Grants: Hands-on learning through an advanced curriculum of grant making. With a spirit of openness and curiosity, we will work along side community partners to research, identify, and award grants to nonprofit programs in the areas below. The Foundation will seed each grant with \$10,000 initially, and members can also participate financially with their Individual Grants.

- **Diversity Partner Grants:** Making our commitment to inclusiveness actionable, we will build relationships with organizations working in diverse communities.
- **International Partner Grants:** Honoring our members' strong interest in global philanthropy, we will build relationships with local organizations doing important work around the globe.
- **Innovation Partner Grants:** Recognizing our members' enthusiasm for discovering creative, cutting-edge projects, we will provide the boost to propel these bright ideas to the next level.

Merit Awards: To acknowledge that all ten organizations appearing on the annual pooled fund ballot are of high merit, we will highlight the work of the five runner-up organizations and make a \$2,000 grant to each.

Special Response Grants: In response to urgent community needs or natural disasters, the Foundation will have the opportunity to make an annual, one-time grant up to \$10,000.

Expanding education

Creating new partnerships with philanthropic and educational organizations to access a broader base of knowledge and offer new programs for members, augmenting our current learning opportunities.

Enhancing community connections

Building bridges with others at the vanguard of philanthropy in order to respond to critical issues in our community.

Strengthening our financial future

Guided by best practices in strategic board governance, the Foundation will continue to manage its business operations in a streamlined, professional manner. Utilizing an array of approaches, we will assure our long-term viability by:

- Establishing the annual member contribution at \$2,500 beginning October 2010;
- Consolidating and transforming committees;
- Broadening the base of fundraising support;
- Continuing to grow the Endowment; and
- Building a Planned Giving program.

Rich array of educational opportunities for members

The Foundation presents a broad spectrum of learning opportunities, such as educational forums, philanthropy skill-building programs, issue discussions, and 'hands-on' grant making.

Our 'flagship' pooled fund grant curriculum

Demonstrating the power of collective giving, members pool their funds and work together in our well-established grant process that awards nearly \$500,000 each year in support of Arts & Culture, Education, Environment, Health, and Human Services in communities across Washington State.

Individual Grants

Each member demonstrates her impact as an individual philanthropist by recommending her \$1,000 Individual Grant to the nonprofit(s) of her choice.

One Woman, One Vote

Every Foundation member makes an equal annual contribution, commits to five years of membership, and has an equal vote in the final pooled grant outcome.

Member engagement flexibility

Members value the ability to scale their individual participation to a level that is personally meaningful. Do a little, or do a lot!

Support for the collective giving model

The Foundation pioneered the concept of large-scale, collective giving. Our model has inspired scores of other organizations nationally who recognize the potential of collective giving as a philanthropic force for community impact. We endorse the growth of this network which encourages women everywhere to realize their full potential as philanthropists.
